

Kennedy School Professor Juliette Kayyem joins LRI Board of Governors

Professor Kayyem is the Robert and Renee Belfer Senior Lecturer and faculty chair of the Homeland Security and Security and Global Health Projects at Harvard's Kennedy School of Government. She is a sought-after voice on national security, crisis planning and cybersecurity and is a frequent contributor to major news outlets such as CNN and *The*

Atlantic. Professor Kayyem's most recent book, *The Devil Never Sleeps: Learning to Live in an Age of Disasters*, was described in a New Yorker profile as an "engagingly urgent blueprint for rethinking our approach to disaster preparedness and response."

Professor Kayyem is a graduate of Harvard College and Harvard Law School, and the mother of three children. She is married to First Circuit Court of Appeals Chief Judge David Barron.
